

#### ASK FOR A SPIRIT OF HOPE

The Lord says, 'I see how you love me, I see how you cling to me, I see how you offer up your sufferings. But I say that a spirit of hopelessness has found its way into many of your hearts and into many of your hearts about things in your families. And so I say to you now, cast out this spirit of hopelessness for those of whom you are praying for in your family.' I feel like the Lord has for many of us a particular person or situation in our family that we should lift up to Him now and ask for that spirit of hope to come in.

#### TAKE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO FORGIVE

Luke 17:3-4: "If your brother sins, rebuke him; if he repents, forgive him. Even if he sins against you seven times in a day and seven times comes back to you saying 'I repent,' you must forgive him." I have a strong sense that there might be someone or multiple people here that have someone they still need to forgive and they haven't done it and the Lord wants you to take this opportunity and to do that.

#### PRAYERS ARE PRECIOUS

I have a sense the Lord is saying to us 'We are leaving a lot of prayers on the table'. He wants us to offer all our aches, and pains and inconveniences for our spouse, our children, our parents, our neighbor, for those we meet at the store or on the train. He doesn't want us to miss the opportunity to pray because prayers are so precious.

#### TAKE TIME TO PONDER WHAT THE LORD HAS DONE

My children, do you not know that Mary pondered? She pondered not only on the things that were happening that day, but she pondered everything, all of Jesus's life, all of her life, all of her husband's life. She pondered and she received strength through gratitude. She became more grateful and more hopeful and she received the strength and the grace that she needed to continue to be the woman that God called her to be. So I say to you, take time, especially during your prayer time to look back - it's okay to look back. As you look back see what I have done in your lives. See all the miracles that I have worked. Know that I have never left you and know that I will never leave you. Come to me, my people, be grateful for what I've done, see my majesty and know that the future will only be better because I will never leave your side.

"Mark 12: 'Jesus replied - listen Israel, the Lord your God is the one Lord and you must love the Lord God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.' Now let me tell you how much I love you. I love you so much more than you can ever imagine. #### The Blessing of the Advent Season







During Advent we have a few special traditions with our children. In such a busy season we try to put our focus back to Jesus in activities as a family.

The first is a Jesse Tree. We have a book that goes along with special ornaments that highlight special moments in the Old Testament leading up to the birth of Jesus. Every night we read from the book and add a new ornament to a small tree we use solely for this activity. The kids look forward to seeing favorite ornaments again and taking turns reading from the book. We also light an Advent wreath after dinner every night.

Our family also chooses 'Advent Angels'. The kids each pick a name from a hat of another sibling. They are supposed to pray for that person, help with their chores, and then on Christmas Eve they give that sibling a special gift. It helps them bond as siblings.

Finally, we make a paper chain of red and green paper that we write good deeds on. There is much more willingness to do chores joyfully when they get to add a link to the chain. We try to make it longer each year.



### A GAP YEAR UPDATE FROM JOHNNY CONANT

Johnny has been living and serving in Belfast, Ireland since this summer, living with the Servants of the Word and serving with UCO.

I want to keep you a bit updated on what I have been doing here in Belfast so far.

I have really enjoyed it here. I have enjoyed working with the people in UCO, getting to meet people in the community and also getting to know the guys in the Servants of the Word house where I am staying.

It has been a busy couple months. I was able to go on a retreat/ mission training in Rostrevor, which is an hour drive south of Belfast, during my first week here. The retreat was with other UCO missionaries in Belfast, Glasgow and London. Then right after that I went to Glasgow for more mission training with Kairos mission year people that are doing similar years as me but only for those who were just doing a mission year.

Then by mid September was really when we began mission work. The first week, we had coffee stalls outside Queens University and were offering tea and coffee and inviting students to different UCO events that week. We were able to get students to different events and have had a good amount of regulars attend.

We usually run football on Monday Nights, worship nights every Tuesday and Bible Studies on Thursdays. My job is trying to help run these events, and to meet up with students one on one to build a relationship with them, to evangelize to them and to help guide and give advice on how to live as a christian.

I also have had much time to pray and to think about what God's will is for my life. Please keep me in your prayers as I continue my mission here.


