

COMPASS'

VOLLEYBALL TUESDAY

Summer is when most people go on vacation and it is a good time to "come away by yourselves to a lonely place, and rest a while" (Mark 6:31). At the same time, we need to ensure that we are "not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another" (Heb 10:25). Compass Volleyball was the perfect solution for Compass for both of these things to happen.

Compass organized Volleyball Tuesdays at Mary street every Tuesday evening this summer from June 15 to August 31. It was open to all young adults, so we were encouraged to invite guests. While no one was obligated to participate in Volleyball Tuesdays, members of Compass enthusiastically showed up each Tuesday and often brought guests along with them. It was a great way for us to not only enjoy volleyball, but also enjoy fellowship with one another and build our own relationships. On an average night, I think we easily had around 30-40 people and on some nights much more. Initially we had only one volleyball court but soon we needed two and even those did not suffice! But it was typical for some people to be playing a game and for others to await their turn to rotate into the court or be part of the next game, which also allowed for fellowship as the games were being played. We started at 7 PM and volleyball would go till 9:30 PM or till there was enough light to keep playing.





On one occasion I noticed that despite it being quite dark no one wanted to leave and people were just having a good time talking to one another. I saw a lot of new faces, which was a very encouraging sign. There were quite a few people from the Petros young adult group in New Brunswick, but there were also people who had never even heard of Compass before. One girl randomly googled Catholic young adult groups in the area and found Compass Volleyball. She was overjoyed to be there!

A few new people asked me what Compass is about and I got to share how we have all of this for free thanks to the people who chose to build their houses on Mary street to build community, and thanks to their generosity we are now able to have these events here to build more community. I described various Compass events like prayer meetings and Lord's days but I emphasized the fact that it is primarily about the relationship and the love for one another and growing together in Christ.

Compass Volleyball was a good way for new people to simply "come and see" (John 1:46). Some new people also showed up to a Compass Lord's day and the first Compass prayer meeting this fall. It was a great way for Compass to reach out to others to invite them in. I think Compass Volleyball was a huge success and the blessing of the Lord was on it. I look forward to what the Lord has for Compass in the fall, and I request your prayers for Compass Basketball!

We have an excellent men's group, the ages run from early 70's to early 90's. All the men are filled with love for the Lord and their neighbor. Friends of his kids and others asked to be added to the list of addressees. Over 90 people have been receiving these excellent daily reflections for over 7 years.

John Dalessio: As you observe the new St. Joseph Chapel being constructed at St. Joseph Shrine in Stirling, you will notice the innovative roof structure designed by John and his engineering firm. He's also helping to ensure the long term stability of the Blue Army Shrine statue of Mary, traveling 130 feet in the air on a crane to inspect it.

Bob Filoramo: In the last couple of years, Bob has had 3 articles published, "St. Paul and the Centurion" in New Oxford Review, "G.K.Chesterton and the Coming Peril" in St. AUSTIN Review, and "Large Catholic Families: A Prophetic Sign" in Homiletic and Pastoral Review and more are in the hopper.

Len Forman: Len plays banjo in the "Good Tyme String Band", which performs at the Berkeley Heights Library on the 2nd Tuesday of the month from 10:30 to 11 AM. Len has been active for 3 years. P.S. If you invite Len for Lord's Day, he brings his banjo, and will play a song or two to entertain you.

CAMP OVERVIEW

Camp Hope 2021 was a phenomenal week filled with joy, community, hard work, and definitely the presence of the Lord. The Camp Hope staff arrived on August 7th to prepare the campus for the long awaited campers who arrived on August 8th. Thus started a weeklong journey through amazing activities, shared meals, gaga, daily mass, exciting night activities, Adoration, thunderstorms, lovely conversations, lots of bugs, and loads of prayer.

One aspect of Camp that really teaches both staff and campers about Jesus Christ is Power Hour. Power Hour is a daily hour-long session of talks, witnesses, time for reflection, and prayer. This year's theme that went throughout the week's talks was Built by Grace. I think this year's Power Hours were especially impactful, possibly because I am now a counselor and understand more, but also because I think this year's talks were incredibly powerful. 
CAMPER TESTIMONY
